- Plan and execute the daily training and competitive activities of the athletes integrating the following four components; physiology, psychology, technical and tactical (choreography)
- Establish and execute a performance appraisal process
- Maintain regular and positive communication with the athletes, working with them to achieve both their individual and team goals
- Ensure Canada Artistic Swimming athletes are well prepared and professionally represent Canada Artistic Swimming and our high-performance program both domestically and internationally
- Ensure that standards for individuals and team behavior are implemented as per policies and quidelines, and communicate this information to athletes/parents and team personnel
