Roles and Responsibilites

The Lead National Stream Coach is responsible for the National Stream program coaching operations, administrative planning, and communiation. Reporting to the Head Coach, Lead Technical Coach and working closely with the Board of Directors, responsibilities include:

- Work collaboratively with associate coaches, athlete families and board to ensure smooth operations of the National Stream training program.
- Maintain communiation with all National Stream athlete families. This includes parent and athlete meetings as well as email/text communication. Respond in a timely manner to questions and concerns from associate coaches and parents in the National Stream program as it relates to scheduling, competitions, processes, etc.
- Manage the National Stream program coaching calendar based on regular coordination with the Head Coach.
- Develop annual, monthly and weekly training plans for National Stream athletes
- In collaboration with the Head Coach and Lead Technical Coach, participate in the selection of National Stream competitive teams & extra routines.
- Participate in professional development (SAS, CAS and any follow ups as needed).
- Collaborate with the Travel Coordinator to organize competition travel plans including developing and/or approving all schedules for the National Stream program.
- Participate in competitive provincial and national competitions as the Lead National Steam Coach including actively supporting associate coaches with different tasks during competition.
- Attend SAS Club and Coaches calls and share relevant information within the Club.
- Participate actively in the organization of the end of season water show.
- In collaboration with associate coaches, organize and participate in the year-end athlete assessments.
- In collaboration with the Head Coach and Lead Technical Coach, organize and participate in the year-end High Performance athlete program assessments.
- Other duties as discussed with the Head Coach, Lead Technical Coach and Board of Directors.

Expectations:

- Previous experience coaching at the competitive or high performance level is required.
- Willingness and ability to attend practices at all Saskatoon Aqualanes pool locations is required.
- This position requires strong organization, coordination, interpersonal and communication skills in addition to artistic swimming technical coaching skills in order to provide high-quality level coaching.
- Ability to work evenings and weekends and to travel to all provincial, national competitions and HP camp as required.

Qualifications:

The following qualifications are required and must be maintained for the season:

- Competition Development, or higher, in compliance with Saskatchewan and Canada Artistic Swimming (SAS and CAS) requirements.
- All required certifications and qualifications to be registered coach as per the CAS Coach Registration and Certification Policy, including up to date Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector Check.
- 5+ years of experience coaching Artistic Swimming
- Respect in Sport and Making Headway online Modules
- In good standing with CAS and current Provincial Sport Organization.

Compensation:

Coaching 20-25 hours a week plus admin hours (*negotiable)

*Depending on the candidate this position could be a full-time position up to a maximum of 35 hours/week
