- 2. Participation in National Team Centre of Excellence Selection Camp / **Phase 2 Junior National Selection Camp** October 28 November 1, 2025
- 3. January-March 2026 JW 2026 Monitoring as led by Head Coach (including a possible camp in January)
- 4. **In-Person 1 Day Camp** before the National Qualifier for final selection phase (part 1) March 2026
- 5. **In-Person 1 Day Camp** after the Canadian Championships for final selection phase (Part 2) May 2026
- 6. **Junior National Team Training Camp** Summer 2026
- 7. 2026 World Aquatics Junior Artistic Swimming Championships (Date and Location TBA)

CAS will select a maximum of 2 coaches to lead the program.
