OVERVIEW

Reporting to the Senior National Team Lead Coach, the Senior National Team Assistant Coach is a member of a support team of coaches, experts, and science and sport medicine professionals who collectively work to ensure that the organization's high-performance plans are implemented to achieve expected program objectives.

This dynamic individual contributes to establishing a high-performance culture of excellence and to motivating and inspiring Senior National Team Program athletes to develop and excel within the established team culture. They are responsible for the execution of the Senior National Team Program – a world leading daily training environment and a competition plan for Canada that is capable of producing international artistic swimming senior-level athletes, teams, and duets with the potential for podium finishes in major international competitions.

Coaching & Athlete Development

- Support the Lead Coach in planning and implementing daily training programs for the senior national team.
- Provide specialized coaching in key areas such as acrobatics, technical elements, synchronization, drills, and skill development.
- Collaborate in the development of routines, choreography, and training plans under the direction of the Lead Coach.
- Offer consistent feedback to athletes to enhance individual skills and overall team performance.
- Support dryland, strength, flex and conditioning programming as required.

Program Support

- Assist in establishing and monitoring team objectives and performance indicators.
- Contribute to the implementation of Canada Artistic Swimming's Code of Conduct in daily training.
- Maintain regular communication with athletes, coaches, and staff in support of individual and team goals.
- Assist with athlete evaluations and contribute to the selection process for teams representing Canada at international events.
- Help ensure team culture and behavioural standards are respected.

Competition & Event Preparation

- Support the competition plan and logistics established by the Lead Coach.
- Assist with routine refinement, analysis, and preparation for World Cups, World Championships, Pan American Games, and the Olympic Games.
- Attend and support athletes at domestic and international competitions as assigned.

Administration & Reporting

- Document training plans, session notes, and athlete progress under the direction of the Lead Coach.
- Contribute to post-event reports and technical debriefs.
- Maintain records within Canada Artistic Swimming's systems and processes.
- Represent Canada Artistic Swimming in a professional manner with athletes, families, and stakeholders.

- University degree or college diploma in Physical Education, Sport Science, or a related field is an asset.
- Minimum NCCP Level 3 (Competition Development) in artistic swimming or international equivalent (working toward Level 4 considered an asset).

- UCCMS participant in Canadian Safe Sport Program, including training and signature of the CCES consent form.
- Vulnerable Sector Criminal Record Check completed within the last two years.
- Current National Lifeguard Certification or equivalent international standard.
- Evidence of high-performance coach experience, ideally with a successful track record of coaching at the international level including proven ability working with a team of athletes who have achieved excellence in their results
- Exceptional artistic swimming technical and analytical skills. Proven ability to develop international level competencies/training standards for senior level athletes
- Strong written, verbal and listening communication skills; with excellent interpersonal and multidisciplinary project skills
- Demonstrated administrative and organizational skills, including time management
- Demonstrated computer literacy and use of current technology, including Microsoft Office 365, Google Drive, Drobox, video and coaching software
- Demonstrated ability to follow established processes, policies and procedures
