- Minimum Provincial Stream-Level: Artistic Swimming Competition Introduction Certified (or equivalent) or Competition Development Coach trained and compliance with OAS and CAS requirements (or planning to)
- Ability to travel locally and provincially.
- Flexibility to work evenings, weekends, to accommodate training schedules and competitions.
- The ability to start in September 2026, from 4 to 20 hours per week, depending on availability and certifications.
