# **Competition Information**

**Pools** 

Indoor Competition Pool: 50-meter stretch pool with spectator seating for 1,000 and deck space for 670 participants.

Depth: Shallow/Warmup 4'2" - 7'2" & Competitive/Dive 7'3" - 14'0"

**Events** 

Junior and Senior events – All technical and free events are separate events. Athletes of the correct age may enter the same event in Junior and Senior. Junior (15-18 yrs. based on year of birth) Senior (15 yrs. or older based on year of birth)



### **Routines:**

Junior Technical Routines (Solo, Duet, Mixed Duet, Team) and Junior Free Routines (Solo, Duet, Mixed Duet, Team, Free Combination)

Senior Technical Routines (Solo, Duet, Mixed Duet, Team) and Senior Free Routines (Solo, Duet, Mixed Duet, Team, Free Combination) Senior Highlight Routine

Open to U.S. clubs, National Teams from all FINA Federations and also open to Foreign clubs with the agreement of the concerned Federation. Federation approval letters will be required for all foreign entries.

### Judges

Every participating National Federation must bring an A or G FINA judge to every World Series meet they enter, up to a maximum of 2 judges. All FINA judges must have successfully passed the Judges Exam administered at a FINA Artistic Swimming Judges Certification School, the online annual exam and be on the current FINA list of Artistic Swimming Officials. Please inform us of the judge(s) that will be a part of your delegation for this competition within the deadline to aquaticsdb@fina.org and to bettyhazle@yahoo.com.

Practice judges are accepted at all World Series events, maximum of 1 judge per Federation per meet. To be accepted as a practice judge, the judge must have passed the FINA Development School-Advanced category test.

Neutral Judges: In the event of low foreign participation, in a ASWS leg, FINA may appoint 1 or 2 neutral judges to ensure a balance between the judges' nationalities. Federations may apply to send 1 neutral judge per Federation to ASWS events. Host National Federation judges may be used if they have FINA status or have passed the Advanced Exam.

For Senior events, only FINA List judges will be seated. For Junior events, FINA, UANA and USA National judges will be seated, with priority to FINA judges.

For Junior events, UANA only Judges must be on the current UANA List(s) of Artistic Swimming Officials and must have passed the most recent FINA Artistic Swimming Judge Certification School test and the FINA online annual exam. A maximum of 1 UANA practice judge per Federation will be accepted. UANA practice judges must have passed at minimum the FINA Development School – Advanced category test. Foreign FINA and UANA judges from Federations not



entered in the America Open Junior division may participate, with priority given to judges whose Federations are entered.
